



Hazardous Waste Technician Lab Packing Specialty

Reports to: Lab Pack Supervisor, Transfer Station Supervisor, or their designates

Duties:

1. Unpacking, identification and sorting of received lab packed wastes
2. Bulking of motor and machine oils, solvents, acids and base solutions as required
3. Field and bench testing of chemicals i.e. ph paper, potassium iodide paper
4. Perform housekeeping duties in lab pack area as well as all areas of TS, lunchroom, office and yard
5. Work off-site at customer locations as required
6. Some overnight travel and weekend work may be required (mobile HHW events)
7. Re-packing chemicals according to industry standards and chemical compatibility for shipment to disposal sites
8. Work in other areas of TS as may be required i.e. operate paint or aerosol crusher
9. Willingness to be a member of the Workplace Health & Safety committee
10. Be a member of Emergency Response Team as outlined in our Emergency Response Guide. Note: once adequate level of training has been achieved
11. Ensure all work is performed safely and within all pertinent regulations (M.O.E. C of A, TDGA, Ontario and National Fire Codes, Canada Labour Code, O.H.S. Regulation)
12. Diligently keep records of all processing
13. Other occasional duties as assigned by TS Supervisor
14. Take samples for analysis as required
15. Responsible for daily housekeeping requirements and daily organization of lab-packing processing station
16. Offloading of trucks delivering waste and/or supplies
17. Loading trucks for transport to disposal or recycling depots
18. Forklift operations
19. Operation of pallet carts and drum carts
20. Ensuring all waste, incoming or outgoing is properly labeled as per T.D.G.A. and MOE regulations
21. Weigh waste products as required
22. Diligently label all waste with proper inventory labels, matching them with provided receiving documents
23. Load trailers with appropriate supplies as directed
